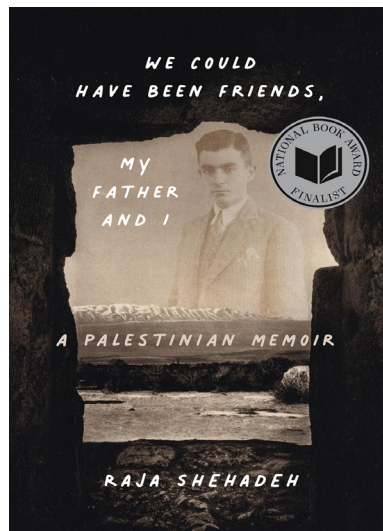

MSU College of Communications, Arts & Sciences faculty member Dr. Saleem Alhabash will share his thoughts on the book, as well as some of his own experiences growing up in Ramallah, Palestine where he was editor of a youth newspaper.

Saleem Alhabash is Professor of Advertising and Public Relations at MSU's Department of Advertising and Public Relations, where he also co-directs the Media and Advertising Psychology (MAP) Lab.
