

INTRODUCTION

This marks the first year in which the Annual Report on Affirmative Action to the MSU Board of Trustees is divided into three documents: Descriptive Report, Data Report, and Diversity Enhancement Report. In addition, the Board will receive under separate cover, a progress report on the MSU IDEA, the University's comprehensive diversity and pluralism plan, published in April, 1989.

The Descriptive Report explains progress that has been made and problems that continue to exist in the areas of affirmative action and equal opportunity. A Diversity Enhancement Report, to be published later, will include a compilation of, and commentary upon, special affirmative action activities in University support units. This Report, the Data Report, utilizing charts, graphs, and tables, illustrates changes in areas for faculty, staff and students as they relate to women, racial minorities, and handicappers.

The implementation of the University's Affirmative Action Program rests with line administrators. Their evaluations include an assessment of their performance in fulfilling affirmative action responsibilities. However, every individual connected with the University has an obligation to support and assist in efforts directed towards achieving this goal.

The Department of Human Relations serves as the principal support unit for enhancing the ability of the University to meet its commitment to affirmative action, equal opportunity, non-discrimination and diversity. A major responsibility of the department involves continuous assessment of policies, practices, and procedures covering the areas of employment, enrollment, publications, and compliance with legal requirements. In addition, the unit evaluates and monitors progress made in achieving the goals of equal opportunity, non-discrimination and diversity in all facets of university life.

The validation of the quality and effectiveness of the University's affirmative action compliance programs is accomplished through review by external agencies as well as by the internal monitoring processes.

Various constituent groups regularly evaluate the internal monitoring process to ensure non-discrimination, equal opportunity and affirmative action. This process of review has put into place recommendations for new and creative solutions to problems encountered in the employment areas.

The Asian Pacific American Faculty and Staff Association, the Black Faculty and Administrators Association, Faculty Professional Women's Association, the Hispanic and Native American Faculty and Staff Association, the Minority Advisory Council, The President's Handicapper Advisory Committee, The Women's Advisory Committees to the Provost and to the Vice President for Finance and Operations, and the four minority student associations, represent some of the groups that work with the University to ensure the success of its Affirmative Action Program. All of these volunteer groups provide vital assistance to the University to assure that the rights of minorities, women, and handicappers, faculty, staff, and students are protected.

Major contributions to this report were made by the Office of Planning and Budgets, the Assistant Provost and Assistant Vice President for Academic Human Resources, the Assistant Vice President of Human Resources, the Vice President for Student Affairs and Services, Admissions and Scholarships, and the Purchasing Department.



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I. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Introduction

The Executive Summary represents a brief synopsis of the 1989-90 Affirmative Action Data Report. Documentation on the academic and support areas of employment is presented in abbreviated fashion along with general information relating to students and the climate of the University.

Academic Human Resources/Executive Management

Academic Personnel represent approximately one half of the total University's workforce. Academic personnel include faculty and staff who interact directly with the instructional, research, and public service mission of the university.

During the 1989-90 affirmative action year, the total academic personnel workforce increased by 42 individuals. A net gain of 56 women, from 1242 to 1298, shows that women now make up 31% of the academic workforce. Minority academic staff grew by 55, boosting their numbers from 483 to 538; they now represent 13% of the workforce, up from 11.% in 1989.

There were six new Executive Management appointments during 1989-90, including one minority man and five non-minority men.

Support Staff

During the 1989-90 affirmative action year, the regular support staff workforce increased by 28 (0.5%) employees from 5,296 to 5,324. The majority of the increase is attributed to minority representation which increased by 25 (3.7%) employees, from 684 to 709. The number of minority women increased by eight (1.6%) from 499 to 507, and the number of minority men increased by 17 (9.2%) from 185 to 202. Total women in the workforce declined by two (0.1%) from 3,538 to 3,536.

Women and minorities comprise 3,536 (66.4%) and 709 (13.3%) respectively of the total support staff workforce. Minority women account for 507 (14.3%) of all women, and 9.5% of the support staff. Minority men represent 202 (11.3%) of all men and 3.8% of the support staff.

Student Enrollment

Enrollment data for the decade indicates a significant increase in the enrollment of minority students on the East Lansing campus. Current minority student enrollment of 4,810 represents 11.9% of the on-campus affirmative action total of 40,460. In Fall 1981 minority enrollment of 3,224 represented only 7.7% of the University affirmative action total. Minority enrollment increased both numerically and in percentage of the affirmative action total for all groups, and has shown steady numerical increases since 1981. Only American Indian/Alaskan Native enrollments have experienced one year of negative growth.

Women as a percentage of the University total have increased from 48.8% in 1981 to the current value of 51.1%.

There is continued growth in the number of graduate minority students with corresponding percentage increases both for affirmative action and University totals. Similarly, graduate women students attend MSU in greater numbers and percentages. In 1990 women graduate students constituted 47.4% of the total graduate enrollment.


Procurement

A significant decrease in total expenditures in 1989-90 explains the comparatively limited amount of actual minority business conducted with MSU. Nonetheless, the percentage of dollars spent with minority vendors has remained relatively constant. This figure signifies considerable effort on the part of buying personnel to develop minority suppliers and provide them with the opportunity to compete for construction business.


Workforce Summaries

II. ACADEMIC HUMAN RESOURCES/EXECUTIVE MANAGEMENT

The October 1990 composition of faculty and academic staff is 5.0% Black, 6.3% Asian/Pacific Islander, 1.4% Hispanic, 0.3% American Indian/Alaskan Native, and 87.0% Caucasian/Other. Women and minorities have increased from 1987 to 1990 both in number and proportion: women from 29.0% to 31.3%, minorities from 11.7% to 13.0% and minorities + majority women from 37.4% to 40.0%.

From 1987 to 1990 there has been a 3.5% (+142) growth rate in academic personnel caused mainly by a 25.1% (+165) increase in temporary staff. Temporary faculty and continuing academic staff have grown by 0.3% (+2) and 1.4% (+9) respectively while tenure system faculty have decreased 1.6% (-34). Blacks have increased from 4.0% to 5.0% (+19 Men, +25 Women), Asian/PIs have increased from 6.0% to 6.3% (-4 M, +24 W), Hispanics have remained at 1.4% (+7 M, -3 W), Amer Inds have remain at 0.3% (-1 M, +1 W), and Cau/Others have decreased from 88.3% to 87.0% (-18 M, +92 W). loss of Asian/PI men is due to the net loss of 20 temporary faculty, 3 tenure system faculty, and 1 continuing staff while temporary staff gained 20. Hispanic women increased by 2 in tenure system faculty but decreased by 4 in temporary faculty and by 1 in temporary staff. The decrease in majority men is due entirely to their decrease in the tenure system (-78). The impact of this decrease is lessened by the addition of 32 temporary faculty, and 27 temporary staff majority men. The gain in majority women is due to the increase of 80 temporary staff women and 15 tenure system women.

The composition of the tenure system is 4.0% Black, 5.1% Asian/PI, 1.2% Hispanic, 0.2% Amer Ind, and 89.4% Cau/Other. Women and minorities have increased from 1987 to 1990 both in number and proportion: women from 18.3% to 20.2%, minorities from 9.1% to 10.6% and minorities + majority women from 25.5% to 28.0%.

The composition of temporary faculty is 4.4% Black, 6.3% Asian/PI, 1.5% Hispanic, 0.5% Amer Ind, and 87.2% Cau/Other. Women and minorities have decreased from 1987 to 1990 both in number and proportion: women from 39.6% to 37.4%, minorities from 17.2% to 12.8% and minorities + majority women from 51.8% to 46.5%. All minority groups except Black men (+6) decreased by 1 to 4 people except Asian/PI men which decreased by 20. Majority men increased by 32, majority women decreased by 5.

The composition of continuing staff is 6.3% Black, 2.4% Asian/PI, 0.8% Hispanic, 0.2% Amer Ind, and 90.4% Cau/Other. Women and minorities have increased from 1987 to 1990 both in number and proportion: women from 44.7% to 45.5%, minorities from 8.8% to 9.6% and minorities + majority women from 49.2% to 49.8%. Many minority groups had no change in number but Black women increased by 3, Asian/PI men decreased by 1, Asian/PI women increased by 4, majority men increased by 1, and majority women increased by 2.


The composition of temporary staff is 6.7% Black, 12.0% Asian/PI, 2.3% Hispanic, 0.7% Amer Ind, and 78.2% Cau/Other. Women and minorities have increased from 1987 to 1990 both in number and proportion: women from 39.0% to 44.3%, minorities from 18.4% to 21.8% and minorities + majority women from 52.2% to 58.5%. All minority groups except Hispanic women and Amer Ind men which have each lost 1 person, have increased as have majority men and women.

The composition of administrators is 9.3% Black, 1.9% Asian/PI, 0.4% Hispanic, 1.2% Amer Ind, and 87.3% Cau/Other. Women and minorities have increased from 1987 to 1990 both in number and proportion: women from 17.0% to 19.3%, minorities from 11.2% to 12.7% and minorities + majority women from 24.5% to 28.6%.

The composition of executive management is 13.4% Black, 1.5% Asian/PI, 3.0% Hispanic, 0.0% Amer Ind, and 82.1% Cau/Other. Women have remained the same in number but have decreased in proportion from 21.0% to 19.4% during the 1987 to 1990 period. There is only 1 minority woman. Minorities have increased from 1987 to 1990 both in number and proportion from 14.5% to 17.9%. Minorities + majority women have increased from 33.9% to 35.8%.

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ACADEMIC WORKFORCE 1987-90



By Employment Category and Gender




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

By Employment Category and Ethnic ID


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


ACADEMIC WORKFORCE 1987-90
Minorities by Ethnic ID and Employment Category



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
ACADEMIC WORKFORCE 1987-90 Administrators by Ethnic ID and Gender

ACADEMIC WORKFORCE 1987-90 Executive Management by Ethnic ID and Gender






All percents are of the total number of Executive Management for the given year.


ACADEMIC WORKFORCE 1987-90

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All percents are of the total number of Tenure System new hires for the given year.



III. SUPPORT STAFF

During the 1989-90 affirmative action year, the regular support staff workforce increased by 28 (0.5%) employees from 5,296 to 5,324. The majority of the increase is attributed to minority representation, which increased by 25 (3.7%) employees, from 684 to 709. The number of minority women increased by 8 (1.6%) from 499 to 507, and the number of minority men increased by 17 (9.2%) from 185 to 202. Total women in the workforce declined by 2 (0.1%) from 3,538 to 3,536.

Women and minorities comprise 3,536 (66.4%) and 709 (13.3%) of the total support staff workforce. Minority women account for 507 (14.3%) of all women, and 9.5% of the support staff. Minority men represent 202 (11.3%) of all men and 3.8% of the support staff.

Minority representation increased by 25 employees, 89.3% of the total increase to the workforce. Minority representation of 13.3% is the highest experienced in Michigan State University's support staff history. These ncreases were reported in administrative-professional by seven (4.2%) from 165 to 172, clerical-technical by five (2.1%) from 241 to 246, and service maintenance by 16 (8.0%) from 201 to 217. The category of cooperative extension decreased by two (3.8%) from 55 to 53 and skilled trades declined by one (6.3%) from 17 to 16. There were no changes in the category of public safety which remains at five.

Representation of women in the workforce declined by two (0.1%) from 3,538 to 3,536. Increases occurred in the categories of administrative-professional by 27 (2.6%) from 1,019 to 1,046, public safety by one (7.7%) from 13 to 14, and in service maintenance by four (1.1%) from 375 to 379. Workforce decreases occurred in the categories of clerical-technical by 25 (1.3%) from 1,982 to 1,957, in cooperative extension by four (3.2%) from 130 to 126, and in skilled trades by five (35.7%) from 19 to 14.

Representation of minority the workforce men in increased by 17 (9.2%) from 185 to 202. Employment increases were reported in the category administrative-professional by three (4.7%) from 64 to 67, clerical-technical by four (16.0%) from 25 to 29, and service maintenance by 12 (15.8%) from 76 to 88. Cooperative extension decreased by one (100.0%) from one to zero, and public safety by one (33.3%) from four to three. There were no changes in skilled trades, which remained at 15 employees.


Non-minority men increased in the workforce by 13 (0.8%) from 1,573 to 1,586. An increase was reported in the category of administrative-professional by 13 (1.8%) from 738 to 751, public safety by one (5.3%) from 19 to 20, service maintenance by two (0.5%) from 399 to 401, and skilled trades by two (0.8%) from 239 to 241. Decreases occurred in the category of clerical-technical by eight (4.7%) from 180 to 172. Cooperative extension remained unchanged with one employee.

Comparing 1988-89 and 1989-90, regular new hires decreased by 146 (24.6%) from 739 to 593. Regular minority new hires decreased by eight (7.3%) from 118 to 110 and women decreased by 107 (27.3%) from 499 to 392. Of the regular minority hires, Blacks accounted for 56 (50.9%), Asian/Pacific Islanders for 19 (17.3%), Hispanics for 28 (25.5%) and American Indian/Alaskan Natives for seven (6.4%).


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SUPPORT STAFF WORKFORCE 1987-90

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


SUPPORT STAFF WORKFORCE 1987-90 By Employment Category and Ethnic ID III-5




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SUPPORT STAFF WORKFORCE 1987-90 Women By Employment Category and Ethnic ID III-6








SUPPORT STAFF WORKFORCE 1987-90

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SUPPORT STAFF WORKFORCE 1987-90 Regular New Hires by Ethnic ID and Gender III-9






IV-A. STUDENT ENROLLMENT

Information pertaining to the enrollment of minority and women students at Michigan State University for the past decade is contained in the attached thirteen tables and twelve graphic presentations. Enrollment data for the a significant increase in indicates enrollment of minority students on the East Lansing campus. Currently minority student enrollment of 4,810 represents 11.9% of the on-campus affirmative action total of 40,460. In Fall 1981 minority enrollment of 3,224 only 7.7% represented of the University affirmative action total. Minority enrollment increased both numerically and in percentage of the affirmative action total for all groups, and have shown steady 1981. numerical increases from Only American Indian/Alaskan Native enrollments have experienced one year of negative growth. University enrollment has been relatively stable over the ten year period. Therefore, numerical gains translate into percentage gains.

Women as a percent of the University total have increased from 48.8% in 1981 to the current value of 51.1%. The 1990 percentage of women is virtually unchanged from 1989. There is continued growth in the number of graduate minority students with corresponding percentage increases both for affirmative action and University totals. 


MICHIGAN STATE UNIVERSITY

Fall Terms 1981 - 1990





MICHIGAN STATE UNIVERSITY Black Enrollment Fall Terms 1981 - 1990





MICHIGAN STATE UNIVERSITY Asian/Pacific Islander Enrollment Fall Terms 1981 - 1990





MICHIGAN STATE UNIVERSITY Hispanic Enrollment Fall Terms 1981 - 1990





MICHIGAN STATE UNIVERSITY American Indian/Alaskan Native Enrollment Fall Terms 1981 - 1990









IV-B. STUDENT RECRUITMENT

The tables outlining applications, offers of admission, and numbers of enrollment by ethnic category generally profile an extremely positive picture for the entering group of Fall 1990. Applications and offers of admission were up strongly for every minority category among freshmen. Actual enrollment figures fell off for Black and Hispanic students as compared to Fall 1989, but still represented a significant percentage of the freshman class which was smaller than Fall 1989. Transfer applications and offers of admission were down for Fall 1990, but actual enrollment for all ethnic categories increased with the exception of Black Graduate application figures for minority students. students were up sharply in 1990 as were offers of admission and actual enrollments. This represents a strengthened effort on the part of graduate departments to recruit minority students.

All of the gains mentioned above come on top of what has generally been a very positive trend for very many years at Michigan State with respect to the recruitment of minority students. At the undergraduate level, notable efforts were made to build new programs and extend old programs on top of activities that have been long standing. Notable highlights include:

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IV-C, SUPPORT SERVICES

The various tables displayed in this section of the Affirmative Action Report describe activities and programs sustained by the University to assist minorities, handicappers, and other protected groups achieve success at Michigan State University.

Tables IV-1 through Table IV-6 display data for the units within the Undergraduate University Division which have affirmative Action goals as their primary mission. These units consist of the Office of Programs for Handicapper Students, Office of Support Services, and the Upward Bound Program.

Special note must be made of the Upward Bound Program which is fixed in size by the level of Federal funds which inhibits any increase in the number of students served from one year to the next. Demand for services from OSS and OPHS, on the other hand, increases each year. The tables do not show the additional pressures on OSS generated by the addition of programs, especially during the summer, over the past four years. The result of increasing demand for services in a time of declining resources is considerable pressure on the staffs and resources of these units. Preliminary data from the KCP program suggests that it is much the same situation.

Tables IV-7 through Table IV-10 illustrate the diversity and richness of academic programs specifically constructed and supported to assure academic success for the minority groups served.

IV-D. AFFIRMATIVE ACTION GRADUATE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

The descriptions and discussion of the various Affirmative Action Graduate Financial Assistance Programs (AAGFAP) show the range of support for women and racial/ethnic minority graduate students at Michigan State University (see MSU 1989-90 Annual Report on Affirmative Action).

Tables IV-1 through IV-6 and Graphs IV-1 through IV-6 show total expenditures, yearly expenditures by program, the number of awards each year, and the racial/ethnic and gender breakdowns of those awards, for those AAGFAP programs funded by the University from 1977-78 to 1989-90.

Tables IV-1 and IV-2, and Graphs IV-1 and IV-2 show that since budget year 1977-78, total AAGFAP expenditures have increased each year with the one exception of a 5.0 percent decline in 1984-85. From 1977-78 to 1989-90, AAGFAP total expenditures increased by nearly 1.5 million dollars (from \$334,869 to \$1,753,483), an increase of 423.6 percent. For specific AAGFAP programs, EOP expenditures increased from \$221,806 in 1977-78 to \$854,859 in 1989-90 or by 285.4 percent; AAGA expenditures increased from \$113,063 in 1977-78 to \$524,537 in 1989-90, or by 363.9 percent; MCDF expenditures increased from \$43,941 in 1979-80 to \$269,320 in 1989-90, or by 512.9 percent; and PF expenditures declined in 1985-86 to 1988-89, but increased from \$89,022 in 1979-80 to \$104,767 in 1989-90, or by 17.7 percent.

Table IV-3 and Graph IV-3 show that from 1977-78 to 1980-81, the number of EOP fellowships awarded to women and minorities declined from 137 to 107. From 1980-81 to 1985-86, the number of EOP fellowships awarded increased to 228. From 1985-86 to 1987-88, the number of EOP fellowships awarded declined from 228 to 165. This decline was due to a necessary increase adjustment of the maximum EOP award level (recommended and approved by both the AAGFAP Policy Group and the AAGFAP Operations Committee), and to the expansion of the AAGA and MCDF programs. From 1987-88 to 1989-90, however, the number of EOP fellowships awarded increased to 227, or by 37.6 percent.

Table IV-4 and Graph IV-4 shows a positive trend from 1977-78 to 1989-90 in the number of AAGA awards held by women and minorities. From 1977-78 to 1987-88, approximately 40 to 50 percent of all AAGA awards were held by Caucasian women. From 1987-88 to 1989-90, however, nearly 60 to 70 percent of all AAGA awards were held by

held by minorities. Other University data show that the overall number of Caucasian women who held regular graduate assistantships increased during the same period.

Table IV-5 and Graph IV-5 show that both MCDF expenditures and the number of awards have increased from 1979-80 to 1989-90. The large increase from 1985-86 to 1986-87 in the number of MCDF awards was due primarily to the expansion of the MCDF program to include a new program developed from the Programmatic Funding Program (conversely, see Table IV-6)

Table IV-6 and Graph IV-6 show that from 1979-80 to 1988-89, the number of programmatic awards remained relatively constant. In 1989-90, however, the number of Programmatic awards more than doubled. This was due primarily to the expansion of Programmatic Funding to include a new program called GOALS.



1979-80 to 1989-90 Fiscal Year



Table V-1 illustrates a four year trend of the total dollars spent on University construction. The figures major construction represent both projects \$100,000 and Board approved) and minor construction (under \$100,00 and facilitated by purchase order). The significant decrease in total expenditures in 1989-90 help to explain the comparatively limited amount of actual minority business. Noteworthy, however, is the fact that the percentage of dollars spent with minority vendors has remained relatively constant. This figure signifies considerable effort on the part of buying personnel to develop minority suppliers and provide them the opportunity to compete for construction ss. Historically, the construction area has been business. targeted as one where minority participation can be maximized. With continued efforts, the University can maintain the encouraging percentages regardless of actual dollars allocated to construction.

Table V-2

The drastic decrease in University construction has necessitated a more intensive effort to develop minority vendors in the equipment and supply areas. Table V-2 represents a four year trend of the potential dollars, actual dollars and percentage of actual to potential dollars spent with both minority-owned and women-owned businesses. As previously noted, potential dollars continue to decrease. This creates the need for increased effort on the part of buying personnel to assure minority businesses a continued level of business activity. Percentages for 1990 are most encouraging: minority businesses were awarded 32.8% of potential dollars, and women-owned businesses were awarded 37.429% of potential dollars.


