

Michigan State University claims a long-standing and firm commitment to the principles of equal opportunity, nondiscrimination and affirmative action. By charter, Board policy, and mission, Michigan State University is pledged to eliminate all inequity based on such considerations as race, creed, sex, age, national origin, sexual orientation, political persuasion and handicap.

Written proclamations issued by the President and the administration cannot alone eliminate all vestiges of discrimination. Rather, it is through the commitment and effort by the entire MSU community that this goal can be achieved. Nondiscrimination and diversity must become integral parts of the everyday operations and practices at Michigan State University. By working together, students and employees have the ability to make this University a model of integration and diversity where study and work can occur in a comfortable and supportive environment.

To fully prepare our students for a multi-cultural and pluralistic society and world, requires that we create an environment at MSU that respects and advances diversity. I, therefore, challenge and encourage every member of our community to continue working together in a cooperative spirit on this very important endeavor.

INTRODUCTION

This marks the second year in which the Annual Report on Affirmative Action to the MSU Board of Trustees is divided into two documents: a Descriptive Report, and a Data Report. In addition, the Board will receive under separate cover, a progress report on The MSU IDEA, the University's institutional diversity plan, published in April 1989 by the Office of the Provost.

The Descriptive Report explains progress that has been made and problems that continue to exist in the areas of affirmative action and equal opportunity. A special section of the Descriptive Report discusses new initiatives introduced by academic, support and student units during the year on behalf of equal opportunity groups. This report, the Data Report, utilizing charts, graphs, and tables, illustrates changes in areas for faculty, staff and students as they relate to women, racial minorities, and handicappers.

The implementation of the University's affirmative action program rests with line administrators. Their evaluations include an assessment of their performance in fulfilling affirmative action responsibilities. However, every individual connected with the University has an obligation to support and assist in efforts directed towards achieving this goal.

The Department of Human Relations serves as the principal support unit for enhancing the ability of the University to meet its commitment to affirmative action, equal opportunity, non-discrimination and diversity. A major responsibility of the department involves continuous assessment of policies, practices, and procedures covering the areas of employment, enrollment, publications, and compliance with legal requirements. In addition, the unit evaluates and monitors progress made in achieving the goals of equal opportunity, non-discrimination and diversity in all facets of University life.

The validation of the quality and effectiveness of the university's affirmative action compliance programs is accomplished through review by external agencies as well as by internal monitoring processes.

Various constituent groups regularly evaluate internal monitoring processes to ensure nondiscrimination, equal opportunity and affirmative action. This process of review has put into place recommendations for new and creative solutions to problems encountered in the employment areas. The Asian Pacific American Faculty and Staff Association, the Black Faculty and Administrators Association, Faculty Professional Women's Association, the Hispanic and Native American Faculty and Staff Association, the Minority Advisory Council, the President's Handicapper Advisory Committee, the Women's Advisory Committees to the Provost and to the Vice President for Finance and Operations, and the four minority student associations, represent some of the groups that work with the University to ensure the success of its affirmative action program. All of these volunteer groups provide vital assistance to the University to assure that the rights of minorities, women, handicappers, faculty, staff, and students are protected.

Major contributions to this report were made by the Office of Planning and Budgets, the Assistant Provost and Assistant Vice President for Academic Human Resources, the Assistant Vice President for Human Resources, the Vice President for Student Affairs and Services, Admissions and Scholarships, Supportive Services, Urban Affairs Programs, Affirmative Action Graduate Financial Assistance Program, and the Purchasing Department.

A synopsis of the Affirmative Action Report appears as an Executive Summary immediately prefacing this report. More detailed information on any specific section of the report or regarding the University's 1990-91 Affirmative Action Program is on file in the Department of Human Relations and available for review.

I. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Introduction

The Executive Summary represents a brief synopsis of the 1990-91 Affirmative Action Data Report. Documentation on the academic and support areas of employment is presented in abbreviated fashion along with general information relating to students and the climate of the University.

Academic Human Resources/Executive Management

Academic Personnel represent approximately one half of the total University's workforce. Academic personnel include faculty and staff who interact directly with the instructional, tesearch, and public service mission of the university.

During the 1990-91 affirmative action year, the total academic personnel workforce decreased by 20 individuals. There was however, a net gain of 62 women, from 1,298 to 1,350, shows that women now make up 32.7% of the academic workforce. Minority academic staff grew by 41, boosting their numbers from 538 to 579; they now represent 14% of the workforce, up from 11% in 1989.

There were seven new Executive Management appointments during 1990-91, consisting of four non-minority men and three non-minority women.

Support Human Resources

During the 1990-91 affirmative action year, the support personnel workforce increased by 14 (0.3%) employees from 5,324 to 5,338. Minority representation reflected a decrease of 14 (2.0%) employees from 709 to 695. Women in the workforce increased by 33 (0.9%) from 3,536 to 3,569. Women represent 3,569 (66.9%) and minorities represent 695 (13.0%) of the support personnel workforce. Minority women account for 500 (14%) of all women, and 9.4% of the support personnel. Minority men represent 195 (11%) of all men and 3.6% of the support personnel.

Student Unrollment

Minority enrollment has increased both numerically and in percentage of the affirmative action total for all groups, and have shown steady numerical increases from 1981. In Fall 1981 mutually enrollment of 3,224 represented only 7.7% of the University affirmative action total. Contently, minority student enrollment of 5,023 represents 12.6% of the on-campus affirmative

action total of 39,716.

Women as a percent of the University have increased from 48.8% in 1981 to the current value of 51.0% for Fall 1991. Women graduate students constituted 47.7% of the total graduate enrollment for Fall 1991.

Purchasing

Between 1989-90 and 1990-91 the dollar amount awarded to minority owned businesses declined slightly from 3,662,149 to 3,321,604. Women owned businesses increased their award amounts from 4,111,249 to 6,003,160 a 69% increase.

In the construction area, minority contracts awarded increased in dollar amounts from 1,643,446 to 3,897,600. However, the percentage of award dollars granted to minorities declined from 18.2% to 8.6% of the total expended in construction between 1989-90 and 1990-91.

Workforce Summaries

The University's workforce is depicted in Tables 1-42 by gender, minority status and employment category.

II. ACADEMIC HUMAN RESOURCES/EXECUTIVE MANAGEMENT

The October 1991 composition of faculty and academic staff is 5.4% Black, 6.8% Asian/Pacific Islander, 1.4% Hispanic, 0.4% American Indian/Alaskan Native, and 86.0% Caucasian/Other. Women and minorities have increased from 1988 to 1991 both in number and proportion: women from 29.6% to 32.7%, minorities from 11.9% to 14.0% and minorities + majority women from 37.6% to 41.7%.

From 1988 to 1991 there has been an overall 3.3% (\pm 133) growth rate in academic personnel although from 1990 to 1991 there has been a slight decrease (\pm 20). The increase is due to a \pm 20,0% (\pm 134) increase in temporary staff and a 6.4% (\pm 39) increase in continuing staff. These increases have more than offset the 3.2% (\pm 19) decrease in temporary faculty and the 1.0% (\pm 21) decrease in tenure system faculty.

Macks have increased from 4.3% to 5.4% (+20 men, +31 women), Asian/ Pacific Islanders have increased from 5.9% to 6.8% (+19 men, +28 women), Hispanics have remained at 1.4% but their number has increased slightly (+3 men, -1 woman), American Indian/Alaskan Natives have increased from 0.3% to 0.4% (+2 men, +4 women), and Caucasian/Others have decreased from 88.1% to 86.0% although there has been an increase in the number of Caucasian/Other women (-81 men, +108 women).

The largest increases in Blacks were in the tenure system (+10 men, +10 women) and in the temporary staff (+8 men, +12 women). Asian/ Pacific Islanders also gained in the tenure system (+1 man, +10 women) and in the temporary staff (+30 men, +23 women), but lost members in the temporary faculty (-11 men, -4 women). Hispanics also gained in the tenure system (+6 men, +1 woman) and in the temporary staff (+1 man, +1 woman), but lost members in the temporary faculty (-3 men, -3 women), and in the continuing staff (-1 man).

The decrease in majority men is primarily due to their decrease in the tenure system (-86) although they also decreased by 16 in the temporary staff. The increase in majority women occurs in all groups except temporary faculty (+26 in the tenure system, +30 in the continuing staff, and +70 in the temporary academic staff). Majority women decreased by 18 in the temporary faculty.

the composition of the tenure system is 4.3% Black, 5.4% Asian/ Pacific Islander, 1.2% the panie, 0.2% American Indian/Alaskan Native, and 88.8% Caucasian/Other. Women and minorities have increased from 1988 to 1991 both in number and proportion: women from 13.7% to 21.1%, minorities from 9.3% to 11.2%, and minorities + majority women from 25.2% to 29.3%.

the composition of temporary faculty is 5.1% Black, 6.3% Asian/ Pacific Islander, 1.6% Historic, 0.2% American Indian/Alaskan Native, and 86.9% Caucasian/Other. Women and indian/ities have decreased from 1988 to 1991 both in number and proportion: women from 18.0%, minorities from 15.4% to 13.1%, and minorities + majority women from 15.4% to 46.9%.


the composition of continuing staff is 6.5% Black, 2.0% Asian/ Pacific Islander, 0.6% httpanic, 0.3% American Indian/Alaskan Native, and 90.6% Caucasian/Other. Women have increased from 1988 to 1991 both in number and proportion (from 44.2% to 47.1%). Minorities have be reased by 3 in number but have decreased in proportion from 9.5% to 9.4%. Minorities the property women have increased by 33 in number and also increased in proportion from 44.2% to 51.1%.

The composition of temporary staff is 7.6% Black, 14.8% Asian/ Pacific Islander, 2.4% Hispanic, 1.1% American Indian/Alaskan Native, and 74.2% Caucasian/Other. Women and minorities have increased substantially from 1988 to 1991 both in number and proportion: women from 40.8% to 47.6%, minorities from 19.1% to 25.8% and minorities + majority women from 53.1% to 62.9%. All minority groups and women have increased while majority men have decreased by 16.

The composition of administrators is 9.5% Black, 2.6% Asian/Pacific Islander, 0.7% Hispanic, 1.1% American Indian/Alaskan Native, and 86.1% Caucasian/Other. Women and minorities have increased from 1988 to 1991 both in number and proportion: women from 20.5% to 20.8%, minorities from 12.1% to 13.9% and minorities + majority women from 28.0% to 31.0%.

The composition of executive management is 10.9% Black, 1.6% Asian/ Pacific Islander, 1.6% Hispanic, 0.0% American Indian/Alaskan Native, and 85.9% Caucasian/Other. Women have increased in number and proportion from 19.4% to 25.0% during the 1988 to 1991 period. Minorities have decreased in both number and proportion from 17.7% to 14.1%. There is only 1 minority woman. Minorities + majority women have increased from 35.5% to 37.5%.




ACADEMIC WORKFORCE 1988-91

By Employment Category and Gender



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
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

Minorities by Ethnic ID and Gender




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

Women by Employment Category and Ethnic ID




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

Executive Management by Ethnic ID and Gender






All percents are of the total number of Tenure System new hires for the given year.



III. SUPPORT HUMAN RESOURCES


During the 1990-91 affirmative action year, the support staff workforce increased by 14 (0.3%) employees from 5,324 to 5,338. Minority representation reflected a decrease of 14 (2.0%) employees from 709 to 695. Women in the workforce increased by 33 (0.9%) from 3,536 to 3,569. Women represent 3,569 (66.9%) and minorities represent 695 (13.0%) of the support staff workforce.

Comparing 1988 and 1991, the support staff has decreased by 26 (0.5%) from 5,364 to 5,338. Minority representation increased by 25 (3.7%) from 670 to 695 and representation of women decreased by 10 (0.3%) from 3,579 to 3,569.


Minority representation from 1988 to 1991, increased by 25 (3.7%) employees. These increases, were reported in administrative-professional by 29 (20.7%) from 140 to 169, cooperative extension by 3 (6.3%) from 48 to 51 and service maintenance by 1 (0.5%) from 209 to 210. Clerical-technical decreased by 6 (2.4%) from 251 to 245 and skilled trades by 2 (13.3%) from 17 to 15. The category of public safety remains at 5.

Comparing 1988 and 1991, representation of women decreased by 10 (0.3%) from 3,579 to 3,569. Increases occurred in administrative-professional by 222 (25.1%) from 884 to 1,106, public safety by 3 (27.3%) from 11 to 14 and skilled trades by 1 (5.3%) from 19 to 20. Decreases occurred in clerical-technical by 219 (11.3%) from 2,149 to 1,930, cooperative extension by 16 (13.6%) from 134 to 118 and service maintenance by 1 (0.3%) from 382 to 181.

Comparing 1987-88 and 1990-91, regular new hires decreased by 227 (46.0%) from 721 to 494. Minurity new hires decreased by 32 (40.0% of minority hires) from 112 to 80 and women decreased by 206 (65.4% of women hires) from 521 to 315.





SUPPORT STAFF WORKFORCE 1988-91 By Employment Category and Gender 111-4




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
SUPPORT STAFF WORKFORCE 1988-91 By Employment Category and Ethnic ID III-5






SUPPORT STAFF WORKFORCE 1988-91 Minorities by Ethnic ID and Gender III-7







SUPPORT STAFF WORKFORCE 1988-91 Regular New Hires by Ethnic ID and Gender III-9

IV. STUDENT ENROLLMENT

Information pertaining to the enrollment of minority and women students at Michigan State University for the past decade is contained in the attached thirteen tables and twelve graphic presentations. Enrollment data for the decade indicates a significant increase in the enrollment of minority students on the East Lansing campus. Currently, minority student enrollment of 5,023 represents 12.6% of the on-campus affirmative action total of 39,716. In Fall 1981 minority enrollment of 3,224 represented only 7.7% of the University affirmative action total. Minority enrollment increased both numerically and in percentage of the affirmative action total for all groups, and have shown steady numerical increases from 1981. Only American Indian/Alaskan Native enrollments have experienced one year of negative growth. University shrollment has been relatively stable over the ten year period. Therefore, numerical gains translate into percentage gains.

Women as a percent of the University have increased from 48.8% in 1981 to the current value of 51.0%. There is continued growth in the number of graduate minority students with topicsponding percentage increases both for affirmative action and University totals. Similarly, praduate women students attend MSU in greater numbers and percentages. In 1991 women araduate students constituted 47.7% of the total graduate enrollment.






MICHIGAN STATE UNIVERSITY Minority Enrollment Fall Terms 1981 - 1991





Fall Terms 1981 - 1991









Fall Terms 1981 - 1991







Fall Terms 1981 - 1991










IV-B STUDENT RECRUITMENT

The tables outlining application volume, offers of admission, and numbers of enrolled students by ethnic category generally profile an extremely positive picture for the Fall 1991 entering cohort. More specific comment, however, is appropriate.

Freshman

Freshman applications, generally, for Fall 1991 were flat. Significant gains were made in all minority categories with the exception of Black students which saw a modest increase. In all minority categories except Native American, gains were made in offers of admission and enrollment gains were realized in all categories except Black students and Native American students. In general, it was a very successful year, but the competitive pressures, particularly for new Black freshmen, were significant, and will continue to be so.


Transfer


Transfer applications were off in 1991, in part attributable to the transition period from quarters to semesters. However, gains were made in all categories with respect to every minority group. Applications increased, offers of admission were significantly increased and final enrollments were greater than the prior year.

Graduate

With the exception of Native Americans, significant gains were made in applications for graduate study from persons from minority groups. The same could be said in terms of offers of admission. However, in terms of actual enrollments, significant gains were realized only with respect to Black and Hispanic students. While the numbers are small, the actual number annulled in other categories fell short of the prior year.

IV-C. STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES

Undergraduate Assistance Program

The various tables displayed in this section of the Affirmative Action Report describe activities and programs sustained by the University to assist minorities, handicappers, and other protected groups achieve success at Michigan State University.

Tables IV-1 through Table IV-6 display data for the units within the Undergraduate University Division which have affirmative action goals as their primary mission. These units consist of the Office of Programs for Handicapper Students, Office of Support Services, and the Upward Bound Program.

Upward Bound Programs are fixed in size by the level of Federal funds available and therefore inhibit any significant increase in the number of students served from one year to the next. Demand and delivery of services from the Office of Supportive Services and the Office of Programs for Handicapper Students, on the other hand, increases each year.

Graduate Financial Assistance Programs (AAGFAP)

The descriptions and discussion of the various Affirmative Action Graduate Financial Assistance Programs (AAGFAP) show the range of support for women and racial/ethnic minority graduate students at Michigan State University (see MSU 1990-91 Annual Report on Affirmative Action Descriptive Report).

Tables IV-7 through IV-12 show total expenditures, yearly expenditures by program, the number of awards each year, and the racial/ethnic and gender breakdowns of those awards, for those AAGFAP programs funded by the University from 1977-78 to 1990-91.

Tables IV-7 and IV-8 illustrate that since budget year 1977-78, total AAGFAP expenditures have increased each year with the one exception of a 5.0 percent decline in 1984-85. From 1977-78 to 1990-91, AAGFAP total expenditures increased by nearly two million dollars (from \$334,869 to \$2,240,947), an increase of 569.2 percent. For specific AAGFAP programs, EOP expenditures increased from \$221,806 in 1977-78 to \$1,022,153 in 1990-91, or by 360.8 percent; AAGA expenditures increased from \$113,063 in 1977-78 to \$753,141 in 1990-91, or by 566.1 percent; MCDF expenditures increased from \$43,941 in 1979-80 to \$423,548 in 1990-91, or by 863.9 percent; and PF expenditures declined in 1985-86 to 1988-89, but increased from \$89,022 in 1979-80 to \$104,767 in 1989-90, or by 17.7 percent. However, PF was at its lowest in 1990-91 with an expenditure of \$42,105.

Table IV-9 shows that from 1977-78 to 1980-81, the number of EOP fellowships awarded to women and minorities declined from 137 to 107. From 1980-81 to 1985-86, the number of EOP

adjustment of the maximum EOP award level (recommended and approved by both the AAGFAP Policy Group and the AAGFAP Operations Committee), and to the expansion of the AAGA and MCDF programs. From 1987-88 to 1990-91, however, the number of EOP fellowships awarded increased to 255, or by 54.5 percent.

Table IV-10 shows a positive trend from 1977-78 to 1989-90 in the number of AAGA awards held by women and minorities. From 1977-78 to 1987-88, approximately 40 to 50 percent of all AAGA awards were held by caucasian women. From 1987-88 to 1990-91, however, nearly 60 to 70 percent of all AAGA awards were held by minorities. Other University data show that the overall number of caucasian women who held regular graduate assistantships increased during the same period.

Table IV-11 show that both MCDF expenditures and the number of awards increased from 1979-80 to 1990-91. The large increase from 1985-86 to 1986-87 in the number of MCDF awards was due primarily to the expansion of the MCDF program to include a new program developed from the Programmatic Funding Program (conversely, see Table IV-12). For 1990-91, both the MCDF expenditures and the number of awards were at the highest. For the 1990-91 year, there was a 30 percent increase in the number of awards with a 57.3 percent increase in expenditure from the previous fiscal year (1989-90).

Table IV-12 show that from 1979-80 to 1985-86, the number of programmatic awards remained near 15 per year. From 1986-87 to 1990-91 the number of awards have been very low at single digits per year except 1989-90 when 13 awards were given. The increase in 1989-90 was due primarily to the expansion of Programmatic Funding to include a new program called GOALS.

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V. AFFIRMATIVE ACTION IN PURCHASING PROGRAM

TABLE V-1

Table V-1 represents a four year trend of the Potential Dollars, Actual Dollars, and Percent Actual of Potential Dollars spent with both minority-owned and women-owned businesses. Demonstrating a commitment to minority participation, many new equal opportunity suppliers have been identified by purchasing personnel. The sharp increase in Potential Dollars, both for minority-owned and women-owned businesses, signifies a sincere effort to actively pursue new minority suppliers and afford them the opportunity to compete for University business. Actual Dollars awarded to minority-owned businesses were very consistent with last year's figure. The drop in Percent Actual of Potential Dollars is explained by the strong effort to identify and support new equal opportunity suppliers. The Actual Dollars Awarded to women-owned businesses were increased by almost two million dollars (approximately 45%). Again, the decrease in Percent Actual of Potential Dollars is due to the favorable increase in Potential Dollars.

TABLE V-2

Table V-2 illustrates a four year trend of the total dollars spent on University construction. The figures represent both major construction (over \$100,000 and approved by the Board of Trustees) and minor construction (under \$100,000 and facilitated by purchase order). Approximately 30 million of the Total Expended last year was a result of the T.B. Simons Power Plant Unit 4 Addition. The construction required for that unit was so highly specialized that very few contractors could qualify--and even fewer equal opportunity contractors. Of the remaining Total Expended, the Actual Minority Business represents a percentage consistent with-or better than--the previous three years.
